

# HIPAA Privacy Policy

MEDTOX Laboratories Inc. is committed to safeguarding the privacy and confidentiality of our patients' protected health information. It is our policy to be in compliance with the requirements of federal and Minnesota state law related to protecting the privacy of health information, including the Standards for Privacy of Individually Identifiable Health Information (45 CFR, Parts 160 and 164 — commonly called the “HIPAA Final Privacy Rule”).

MEDTOX has compiled several policies and procedures that outline the steps that will be taken by MEDTOX to ensure compliance with the HIPAA privacy standards, effective April 14, 2003, and Minnesota state laws related to protected health information. All employees will receive appropriate training on these policies and procedures, and it is the responsibility of each individual to follow the policies and procedures in the performance of their jobs. If an employee has questions regarding the privacy policies, he/she should contact his/her supervisor and/or the HIPAA Privacy Officer.

The HIPAA Privacy Officer is responsible for developing and implementing privacy policies and procedures.
